After earning a bachelor's degree in electronic engineering from Sapienza University of Rome in 1987, she received a Ph.D. in Computer Science from the same university in 1992.

She is a Full Professor of Information Processing Systems at Sapienza University of Rome, where she has been teaching and conducting research since the late 1980s, contributing significantly to the development of academic computer science in Italy.

Throughout her career, she has held numerous positions of academic and institutional responsibility, including Director of the Department of Computer Engineering, Automation, and Management at La Sapienza, a role she held until 2024, as well as Deputy Rector for Infrastructure and Technologies (2010–14), promoting a profound renewal of the university's digital services and infrastructure. Since May 2025, she has served as Director of the Institute of Cognitive Sciences and Technologies (ISTC) at the National Research Council (CNR), further establishing her reputation as a leading authority within the public research sector. Furthermore, from 2011 to 2017, she served on the board of directors of CINECA — an interuniversity consortium and Italy's leading organization for supercomputing and the provision of advanced services to the research community — and from 2015 to 2017, she was president of Kion S.p.A., a company within the CINECA group. Finally, since 2020 she has been a member of the Higher Council of Public Works and, since 2025, of the National Bioethics Committee of the Presidency of the Council of Ministers.

She has focused her scientific work primarily on the fields of human-computer interaction, databases, and data quality in information systems, with a scientific output that includes over 200 publications in international journals and conferences, as well as numerous reference volumes. In recent years, she has focused her research on the ethics and governance of artificial intelligence, becoming a founding member and President of the Italian Society for the Ethics of Artificial Intelligence (SlpEIA).
